

The meaning of your Computerized English Proficiency Test (AMIRAM) score

The Computerized English Proficiency Test score is reported on a scale ranging from 50 to 150 points. The table on the other side of the page will show you the percentages of examinees who obtained scores that are lower than, similar to or higher than your own.

Distribution of examinee scores

The table presents the distribution of examinee scores. It is divided into 17 score ranges. For each of the ranges, the percentages of examinees whose scores fall above, within or below that range are given. The distribution is for illustration purposes only. For example, an examinee who scored 112 on the test falls within the 110-114 score range. Approximately 55% of examinees scored below that range, some 8% scored within the range, and some 37% scored above the range.
