

# Computerized Hebrew Proficiency Test (YAELNET)

## Instructions for Examinees

You are about to take the YAEL Hebrew Proficiency Test.

The test contains three sections. Each of the first two sections contains three types of questions: Sentence Completions, Restatements, and Reading Comprehension. In the third section, you will write an essay. No experience with computers is needed in order to take this test.




You will first be given explanations about the test and several sample questions. After that, you will begin the actual test. Reading the instructions and answering the sample questions do not use up time allotted for the test. Read the explanations carefully and answer all of the sample questions.


To continue, click the  button in the lower right-hand part of the screen.


### About the Test

---

The first two sections of the test consist of multiple-choice questions. Each question is followed by four possible answers. Choose the best answer by clicking the circle next to it. After you choose an answer, the button for that question (on the right side of the screen) will change color. To change your answer, click the circle next to a different answer. When the test is scored, only the last answer you chose will count.

Click  to flag the questions you wish to return to. A dotted line will appear around the button for that question. When you return to a question you flagged, the  button will change to . After you have answered the question and no longer want the reminder, click .

Within each section of the test, you can move from one question to another either by clicking  or by clicking the question number.


Click  to continue.

### Time

---

Each section is allotted a certain amount of time which can be used only to answer the questions in that section. The time remaining for the section can be seen at the lower right-hand part of the screen, under the

button  .

If you have answered all the questions in a particular section and still have some time left, use it to check over your answers. If you have finished answering all the questions in a particular section before the allotted time has elapsed and you wish to move on to the next section, you may do so by clicking the  button that appears on the lower right-hand part of the screen.

**Please Note:**

Using only part of the time allotted to a particular section will not give you more time to use for another section! You may not return to a previous section, even if you did not use all the time allotted for it.

Click  to continue.

## Test Score

---

Your test score is calculated on the basis of your scores on the first two sections and on the essay. The score for each of the first two sections is calculated only on the basis of the correct answers. No points are deducted for incorrect answers. Therefore, even if you are not certain of the correct answer, it is worthwhile to mark an answer for each question! Guessing cannot harm your score; it can only improve it.

**Please note:** You are not allowed to use a dictionary or any other study aids on this test.

If you have any questions, raise your hand and wait for the proctor to approach you.

You may now return to any of the explanations by clicking the buttons on the right side of the screen, or you may begin the test. Once you begin the test, you may not return to the explanations. Therefore, begin the test only once you are certain that you understand all of the explanations.

To begin the test, click  .
